Grenzenlos promotes Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) and Global Learning in vocational schools. International students from countries in Africa, Asia, and Latin America design lessons on globalization topics and the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. Their teaching concepts encourage a change of perspective in the classroom. The program is based on the Framework for Global Development of the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education, Science and Cultural Affairs (KMK) and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).

Education for sustainable development (ESD) empowers people to think and act in a sustainable manner. It enables each individual to understand the impact of their own actions on the world.

Global Learning focuses on understanding global connections and taking responsibility for acting in a solidaric, sustainable, and globally conscious way.

Teaching cooperations:

Teacher training:

Grenzenlos offers free, accredited training courses on ESD and Global Learning, including practical guidance, materials, and networking opportunities.



School development:

Particularly committed schools can become a "Grenzenlos School." This ESD school label recognizes schools that actively integrate Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) and Global Learning into their daily school life and is awarded through a certification process. "Grenzenlos Schools" are tracked nationwide using a standard indicator and are included in the German Federal Government's Sustainability Report.



I NTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Students from countries in Africa, Asia, and Latin America can be trained as "Facilitators for Global and Intercultural Education" through free one-day and weekend seminars.

In four modules, they learn about ESD and Global Learning and develop their own teaching concepts for teaching cooperations at vocational schools.
